Navan councillor, Mr. Paddy Fitzsimons, has called for an effort to reopen the Boyne Canal.

"At present it's unsightly and sometimes smelly," Mr. Fitzsimons told Monday's meeting of Meath Co. Council. He was referring to the section outside Navan. Part of the problem could be attributed to septic tanks in the area "gone haywire," he said.

It was a pity that such an amenity should be let fall into disuse, he added, and suggested asking the Dublin/Eastern Regional Tourism Organisation to put some effort into it. Mr. Paddy Traynor agreed that a clean-up would give a

boost to tourism. One way of tackling the restoration of the canal would be through a social employment scheme. Mr. Robert Doonan said development of sections of the canal could be done in a piecemeal fashion. The Co. Council could co-operate with local groups using social

employment schemes or amenity grants. A local architect had drawn up plans for reflooding the canal, said Mr. John Murtagh. "The problem seems to be
